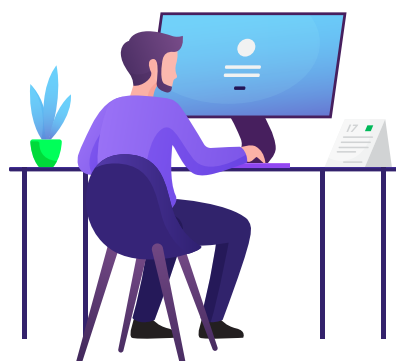


Microsoft's New Sign-In Changes: Convenience vs. Security?



Key Highlights of the New Sign-In Change



Stay Logged In Forever?

Starting February 2025, Microsoft will keep you signed in unless you manually sign out or use Incognito/Private Browsing mode.



The Security Risks:

Forget to log out?

Anyone on a shared or public computer can access your account.



Risky for:

Outlook

Microsoft 365

Microsoft account page



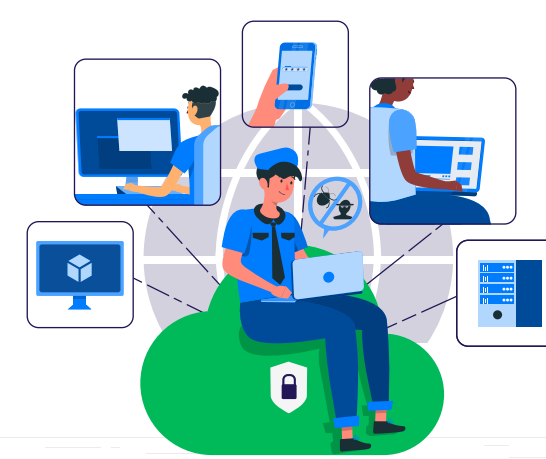
Steps to Protect Yourself:

Use private browsing to avoid saved logins.

Always manually sign out

Click your profile picture → Hit "Sign out"

Close all browser windows



Impacts Beyond One Site:

This change applies to:

All Microsoft services

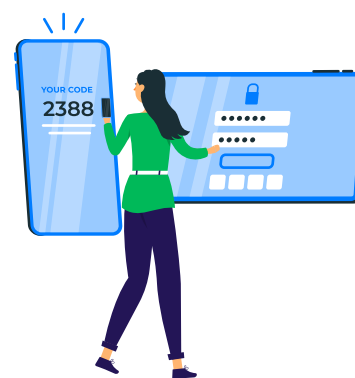
Linked accounts (e.g., Office, Teams, etc.)



Use Passkeys:

Microsoft recommends passkeys as a password-free, safer alternative.

Think of it as a digital key for your accounts.



Be Cautious with:

Authenticator Apps or Security Keys — They won't ask for re-authentication after your first login!

Final Takeaway

While Microsoft is focused on convenience, this change could be a privacy and security headache for users.

Always log out when using shared devices and prioritize secure browsing!

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
